

New Environmental Education Facility Coming Soon to Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge



Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge would like to announce that construction of a new 4,000 square-foot outdoor education classroom facility will be starting soon near Zimmerman, Minnesota. Construction is slated to begin in mid-September 2014, with a scheduled completion date of October 31, 2015.

This facility will allow the refuge to better meet the National Wildlife Refuge System mission by providing expanded environmental education and interpretation opportunities. Sherbune Refuge has offered wildlifedependent recreation opportunities like these for many years, as well as hunting, fishing, wildlife observation, and wildlife photography. Much thanks to the long-running support of the Friends of Sherburne, this new resource will be the hub of an ever-growing education program.

This facility will consist of two classrooms, indoor and outdoor accessible bathrooms, and a Friends of Sherburne gift store. The building will be used for numerous educational programs throughout the year, regardless of the weather. One of the educational activities will be "EE Days" where several area schools bring 600 students annually to the refuge as part of their science curriculum.

The building will also be used for numerous refuge events throughout the year and for special training opportunities for teachers and environmental groups. Currently, Sherburne Refuge has more than 80,000 visitors a year and anticipates that this new facility will only increase the visitation to the area. In return, this higher visitation will help stimulate the economy of all the surrounding communities.

The timing of this facility could not be better, as Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge will be celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2015. The building has also been designed so that a large visitor center addition could be added in the future, if funding should allow.

The facility will be located on the south side of County Rd 9 just southwest of the Sherburne Refuge headquarters. Sherburne National Wildlife Refuge is a 31,000-acre refuge located in Sherburne County and is one of more than 560 refuges in the National Wildlife Refuge System managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

• Children often grow and improve their skills through play. Our new space will have extra room for jumping, climbing, bicycle riding and more.


• Many of our patients visit us on a regular basis. We want to create a bright and welcoming kid-friendly atmosphere. Like our specialized care team, it would be designed just for children!

FINANCIAL FOCUS: Protect Your Retirement against Market Volatility

As an investor, you're well aware that, over the short term, the financial markets always move up and down. During your working years, you may feel that you have time to overcome this volatility. And you'd be basing these feelings on actual evidence: the longer the investment period, the greater the tendency of the markets to "smooth out" their performance. But what happens when you retire? Won't you be more susceptible to market movements?

You may not be as vulnerable as you might think. In the first place, given our growing awareness of healthier lifestyles, you could easily spend two, or even three, decades in retirement – so your investment time frame isn't necessarily going to be that compressed.

Nonetheless, it's still true that time may well be a more important consideration to you during your retirement years, so you may want to be particularly vigilant about taking steps to help smooth out the effects of market volatility. Toward that end, here are a few suggestions:

• Allocate your investments among a variety of asset classes. Of course, proper asset allocation is a good investment move at any age, but when you're retired, you want to be especially careful that you don't "over-concentrate" your investment dollars among just a few assets. Spreading your money among a range of vehicles – stocks, bonds, certificates of deposit, government securities and so on – can help you avoid taking the full brunt of a downturn that may primarily hit just one type of investment. (Keep in mind, though, that while diversification can help reduce the effects of volatility, it can't assure a profit or protect against loss.)

• Choose investments that have demonstrated solid performance across many market cycles. As you've probably heard, "past performance is no guarantee of future results," and this is true. Nonetheless, you can help improve your outlook by owning quality investments. So when investing in stocks, choose those that have actual earnings and a track record of earnings growth. If you invest in fixedincome vehicles, pick those that are considered "investment grade."

• Don't make emotional decisions. At various times during your retirement, you will, in all likelihood, witness some sharp drops in the market. Try to avoid overreacting to those downturns, which will probably just be normal market "corrections." If you can keep your emotions out of investing, you will be less likely to make moves such as selling quality investments merely because their price is temporarily down.

• Don't try to "time" the market. You may be tempted to "take advantage" of volatility by looking for opportunities to "buy low and sell high." In theory, this is a fine idea – but, unfortunately, no one can really predict market highs or lows. You'll probably be better off by consistently investing the same amount of money into the same investments. Over time, this method of investing may result in lower per-share costs However, as is the case with diversification, this type of "systematic" investing won't guarantee a profit or protect against loss, and you'll need to be willing to keep investing when share prices are declining.

It's probably natural to get somewhat more apprehensive about market volatility during your retirement years. But taking the steps described above can help you navigate the sometimes-choppy waters of the financial world.
