

The ceremony took place on January 5th, 9:30 a.m. at our local Coborn's Store; the check was presented to us by manager, Ron Engh. The check has been on display at Coborn's and will be at the Business and Community Expo on March 7th, 2015.

Our PAVC has been working on many different funding projects for a few years to build the amphitheater. Having started the idea for this project in 2009, it has been a journey of planning, the surveying, the architectural drawings, permits, flood studies and more. The Otto Bremer Foundation donated \$45,000, the Initiative Foundation \$10,000. Those funds were spent on the before-mentioned workable planning.


The "recession" has made it hard to raise funding to proceed, as we have written in previous articles. The \$10,000 given by the Coborn Corporation is to be used solely for building of the theater, it is not to be used for fundraising. 




