## Bond Referendum

A message from Supt Ben Barton:

Princeton Public Schools Mission is to be an innovative leader in instruction developing in every learner the ability to succeed in an ever-changing world. To accomplish our mission we have evaluated the state of our facilities and the impact they make on the education of our students. The district then formed various committees to establish building criteria and opportunities for improvements, and most recently the Options Committee presented a final recommendation to the school board and the community.



Our ISD 477 School Board of Education voted unanimously at the February 18th meeting to move forward with the recommendations from the community facility Options Committee. The board adopted a resolution to hold a bond referendum on May 12, 2020 for district residents to vote on a \$49.5 million dollar project to address specified facility needs at Princeton High School, Princeton Intermediate School, and Princeton Student Services building. The scope of the proposed project does not include any design features. If the bond were to pass, we would have an extensive process which would include stakeholders to help provide input on design and layout.

Some of the issues at the high school that would be addressed with the referendum include: secure entry, right-sized classrooms & labs, modernized IT shop areas, address circulation spaces, media & commons, expanded activities areas, expanded kitchen, and improved spectator access and amenities. Some of the issues at the intermediate school that would be addressed with the referendum include: special education renovations, upgrade and expand specialist areas, expand cafeteria and build new kitchen, and improve existing gym. Some of the issues at the student services building that would be addressed with the referendum include: renovations to allow improvements in cafeteria and classroom space.
